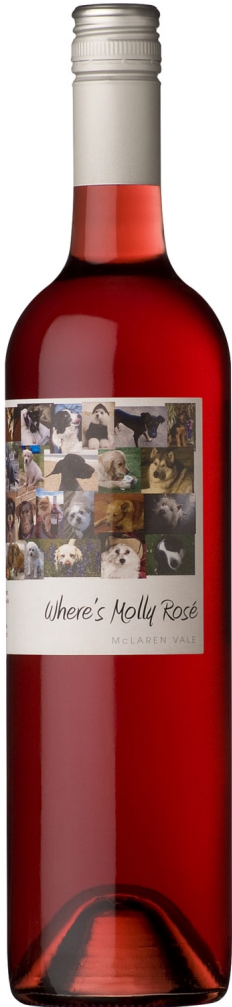

TASTING NOTE



### THE NAME

Molly, a much loved German Shorthaired Pointer, was a gracious hostess at the Maxwell Winery cellar door. Not only was she very adept at disappearing quietly after greeting visitors to the winery, in her younger days she would wander the vineyards of McLaren Vale far and wide. Though she might not have necessarily known it, the question was often asked... "Where's Molly?"

### THE LABEL

A fun label for a fun wine. Featuring photographs of 40 dogs, it really is a case of "Where's Molly?" Many of the dogs are pets of our cellar door members from all over Australia... these owners kind enough to send us some terrific images to make this label possible. There is a clue included on the label to help in locating Molly, just to keep everyone busy while enjoying the contents...

### COLOUR AND AROMA<sup>1</sup>

Brilliant crimson red. This vibrant rosé displays delicious strawberries & cream, with hints of raspberry.

### PALATE<sup>1</sup>

Summer berry fruits fill the palate, balanced by the flesh of Satsuma plum. The freshness of watermelon arrives at the finish, completing a wine that is perfectly matched to light meals and warm summer nights.

### CELLARING POTENTIAL

This wine is made to enjoy upon release through to 12 months, delivering a youthful vibrancy of fruit flavour.
